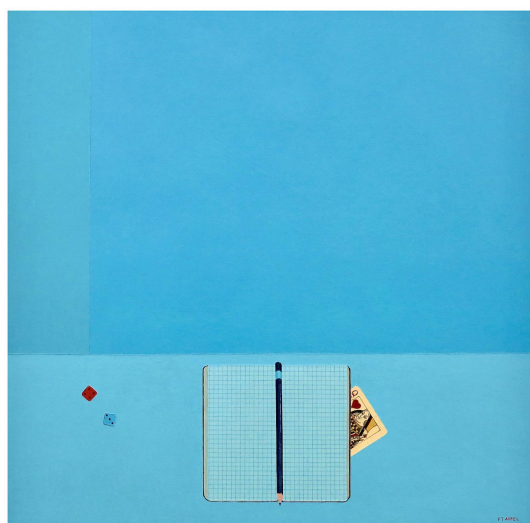
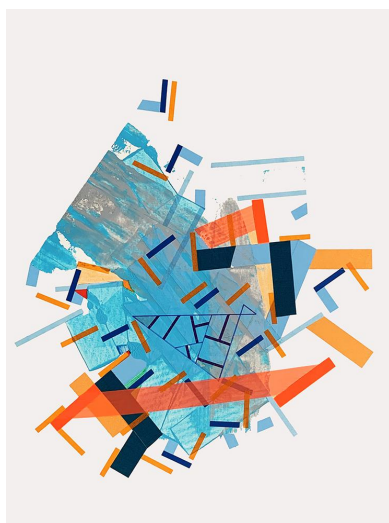

Radius 50

July 15 – September 11, 2022

Opening Reception: Saturday, July 16 | 4-6pm



(Woodstock, NY) – The Woodstock Artists Association & Museum is pleased to announce *Radius 50*, on view in the Main Gallery from July 15 – September 11, 2022. *Radius 50* is an annual exhibition highlighting some of the best artwork in the Hudson Valley. This year's presentation is juried by Jayne Drost Johnson of JDJ in Tribeca and the Ice House in Garrison, NY. The juror selected work from a call for submissions from artists living within a 50-mile radius of Woodstock. WAAM will host a public reception to celebrate the opening of a new round of exhibitions on Saturday, July 16 from 4-6pm.

For this exhibition, Drost Johnson chose works that express a joyful, bursting energy. Works on view are mostly abstract, though they are diverse in their formal characteristics and include painting, sculpture, drawing, and collage. The varied works come together in their nuanced approach to abstraction and shared capacity to express the unique personalities of each of the exhibition's 21 artists. The result is a bold and colorful presentation befitting the summer season.
